1 An act to require the drug testing of all drivers involved in an accident.
2
3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
4
5 Section I: This bill will require all drivers that cause accidents on Kentucky highways to
6 submit to a drug test.
7
8 Section II: By drug testing all drivers involved in traffic accidents we will help protect
9 other motorists on Kentucky highways. This bill will also help decrease the
10 amount of drivers on that consistently drive while under the influence.

12 Section III: The funding for this bill will come from the fines levied on the driver who was
13 responsible for the accident. The cost of the exam will be added to the standard fine.
14
15 Section IV: State and local law enforcement agencies, in conjunction with the court
16 system, will be in charge of enforcing this new policy. If the driver is under the legal
17 age of 18, the parents/legal guardians also become responsible for the fulfillment of this policy.
18
19 Section V: Penalties for non-compliance with this new law will be as follows:
20 1st Offense: Driver will be fined \$150.00 and they will be placed on probation.
21 2nd Offense: Driver will lose their license and serve a jail sentence of one week.
22
23 Section VI: This bill will go into effect 30 days upon passage.
