1	An act to promote more awareness of teen suicide in schools.
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3	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
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5	Section 1: Currently, teenagers in Kentucky are committing suicide at a much higher rate than other states in
6	the nation. The purpose of this bill is to reduce the number of suicides and suicide attempts by promoting
7	more awareness of this growing epidemic.
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9	Section 2: Bullying prevention should be promoted more throughout the schools. One way to curb bullying,
10	which can be a factor in youth suicide, is to create a "buddy system." All students will be paired with a
11	compatible person that they can trust. They will help each other through the school year. When students
12 13	know they can trust each other they will more likely tell their problems and concerns. Therefore, a one week
15 14	bullying program is necessary to see the ins and outs of bullying that might cause a suicide or an attempt.
15	Section 3: A youth suicide awareness program will also be implemented that will go hand in hand with the
16	bullying prevention. The current mandatory video that is shown in schools will be replaced. Students will
17	learn about the signs of suicide and what to do when they encounter them. Many students do not take the
18	mandatory video seriously. Therefore, a new one shall be made, along with having guest speakers and hands
19	on learning activities to fully learn about youth suicide and how to prevent it.
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21	Section 4: This program will cost next to nothing compared to the lives that it could save. To make a better,
22	more believable video it would cost around \$3,000, and then another \$1,000 to create a week of programs
23	that promote youth suicide awareness and prevention. This bill will go into effect next school year.

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
