3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: Use of prohibited and illegal drugs are dangerous and a growing problem among teens. In order to
6 help combat the increased use the Commonwealth of Kentucky will require schools districts to implement
7 and monitor a uniform drug testing policy for all students involved in extra curricular activities. this policy will
8 require students to submit to random testing as well as be tested at the time of their yearly physical.

10 Section 2: The Kentucky Department of education will be responsible for drafting and implementing this plan.
11 They will consult with local school boards on the best means for implementation.

13 Section 3: Further expense and implementation costs will be the responsibility of Local School districts.

15 Section 4: This will go into effect the school year after passage.
