1 An act to allow charter schools in the commonwealth of KY.

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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

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5 Section 1: Schools designated as charter schools by the KY department of education may receive funding as
6 privately run, however publicly accountable schools.

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8 Section 2: Charter schools will receive the same funding per pupil as all other schools funded by the KY
9 department of education. Tuition must not exceed \$750 per year.

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11 Section 3: Charter schools do not have to follow the curriculum set forth by the KY department of education.
12 However, the schools must remain completely secular to any race, religion, or culture.

13
14 Section 4: Charter schools must take all standardized tests required by the KY department of education. If
15 they fail on those tests two years in a row, the schools will be subject to a review by the KY department of
16 education and may be stripped of their funding.

18 Section 5: This bill will go into effect on July 1, 2014 by granting the charter school and then the school may
19 start on July 1, 2015.
