1 An act to remove all personal entertainment devices from prisons in Kentucky.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section I: The purpose of our bill is to eliminate all the entertainment and social media from prisons
6 throughout Kentucky other than from the common areas for educational purposes only, such as; the library,
7 cafeterias, or recreation rooms. Products such as Xbox, PlayStation, Televisions, and any internet access
8 (other than the common areas where they can be monitored.)

9
10 Section II: Prisoners will still be able to get books from prison libraries. There will still be televisions in
11 common areas for recreational purposes only (like the cafeterias, library, or recreation rooms), though there
12 will be no personal devices. No jail cell will have any personal devices such as the following; game consoles,
13 Phones, TVs, computers, etc.

15 Section III: If any personal items are found outside of the common areas (such as the Cafeteria, the
16 Recreation room, or the Library) will be taken away and donated to charity.

18 Section IV: There will be not cost in the implementation of this Bill.

20 Section V: This Bill will go into effect on July, 2014.
