1 An act to require all restaurants to provide customers with a complete list of ingredients of all menu items, in
2 order to prevent anaphylactic shock.

4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

6 Section 1: Over 15 million people in America suffer from food allergies. This bill is designed to protect those
7 with food allergies through detailed menu labeling of food served in restaurants.

10 Section 2: Individuals with food allergies should have the ability to read menu ingredients and make safe
11 decisions about what they are eating.
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13 Section 3: This bill will cost restaurants a normal amount in printing with ingredient lists printed on the
14 menus, menu boards and drive-thru menus.
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16 Section 4: Penalties for non-compliance of this law are:

- 17 \$500 - 1st offense
- 18 \$700 - 2nd offense
- 19 \$1000 - 3rd offense
- 20

21 Every offense thereafter may result in 14-day closure of restaurant.
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23 Section 5: This bill will go into effect on Jan. 1, 2016.
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
