1 An act to authorize sharing of prescription monitoring program information with prescription monitoring
2 programs located in other states.
3

4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

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6 Section 1: This bill will authorize different states prescription monitoring systems to share information with
7 the prescription monitoring system of Kentucky known as KASPER (Kentucky All Schedule Prescription
8 Electronic Reporting).
9

10 Section 2: The NABP (National Association of Boards of Pharmacy) will provide prescription monitoring
11 information in response to requests from prescription monitoring programs in other states. This exchange of
12 information will take place through an existing secure interstate data exchange system (Kentucky will simply
13 be added to this existing network). The information accessed through this exchange will only be accessible to
14 those with access to the exchange network and is protected health information only.

16 Section 3: Kentucky's existing prescription monitoring system (KASPER) will make software adjustments as
17 needed to authorize access to shared network. NABP will oversee the security of the existing network and
18 data transmitted between states.

20 Section 4: KASPER has an existing technology department with allocated funding so any software updates
21 will come at no additional cost to the state of Kentucky.

23 Section 5: This bill will go into effect 6 months after passage.
