An act to An act to require corporations to use recycling bins.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section I: The implementation of this program will require recycling by corporate entities registered with the Secretary of State in the Commonwealth of Kentucky and to not use conventional landfills.

Section II: Corporations will be required to recycle. The city will provide a pick up service for the recyclable materials. The table represents the population range for cities that will be required to recycle and be provided with a pick up service.

Section III: The implementation of this program will cost \$1,440 per corporation annually. The program will be paid for with funds collected from a 2% grocery tax. The Commonwealth will save landfill space and will also see a reduction in Sanitation Department cost due to the amount of recycling.

Section IV: The corporations will be required to recycle all recyclable materials. If they do not, the fines for violations of the program are as follows:

- First Offense: \$25 times the number of employees
- Second Offense: \$50 times the number of employees
- Third Offense: \$100 times the number of employees
- (Every offense thereafter will be charged at a rate of \$150 per employee)

Section V: Upon passage, this bill will go into effect on the 24th of September 2014.
