6 7 8 9 10	Section 1: This bill would require all Kentucky schools to store at least 2 Epinephrine Auto Injectors that are not prescribed to any school student or staff member. This bill would change the current statute to allow schools to use this EpiPens on students or staff facing severe allergic reactions without a prescribed EpiPen in storage at the school.
11 12 13 14 15	Section 2: These EpiPens will be paid for by each school's state allotted funding for each school year. The school must have at least 4 teachers or administrators take a class and be certified to inject EpiPens. Schools that have students under 66 pounds must have at least 1 Jr. EpiPen in storage which can be used in the same manner as outline in Section 1.
16 17 18 19 20 21 22	Section 3: Every school in the state of Kentucky must go through at least 4 random yearly inspections to make sure that this bill is reinforced. If this bill is not reinforced, the punishments will be as follows: 1st offense: \$5,000 fine and the requirement of buying 2 EpiPens 2nd offense: \$10,000 and the requirement of buying 2 EpiPens 3rd and final offence: \$15,000 and a requirement of buying 2 EpiPens.

23 Section 4:This bill will go in effect the next schools year after this bill is passed.
