1 An act to require an age limit of 16 to purchase energy drinks at all business locations that sale this type of
2 beverage in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
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4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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6 Section 1: Consumers must be 16 years of age or older to purchase energy drinks. Consumers will have to
7 show proof of identification to make this purchase.
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9 Section 2: An energy drink can be defined as a beverage containing 6 milligrams or more of caffeine per
10 fluid ounce. These are the beverages that will be banned for sale for consumers under the age of 16. The
11 Kentucky Cabinet of Health and Family Services are responsible for creating a list of the banned energy
12 drinks. This list will not include teas and soda unless marketed as an energy promoting beverage. The
13 Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services will work with Kentucky retailers to inform them of changes
14 that this bill makes for their individual business.
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16 Section 3: Businesses that fail to adhere to this bill will be fined in the following sequence:
17 1st Offense: \$100 Fine and a Written Warning.
18 2nd Offense: \$250 Fine and Second Written Warning
19 3rd Offense: \$500 Fine and they will be reported to the Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services.
20 4th Offense: The Kentucky Cabinet for Health and Family Services will investigate the business and come up
21 with a course of action which could include license suspension and possible revocation of license.
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24 Section 4: This bill will go into effect 6 months after passage.
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
