1 2	An act to require Kentucky school administrative staffs to have access to a firearm on school property in case of a threatening intruder.

4	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
5	
6	Section 1: This bill only legalizes a Glock 19 9 mm to be kept on school grounds. The maximum number of
7	firearms in one school is three. All firearms must be kept in a safe(s) approved by the local police. Firearms
8 9	can only be accessed when the intruder(s) physically assaults with a weapon or threatens with physical
	violence on a student/staff member.
10	
11	Section 2: Before the school administrator receives the weapon(s) they must complete the following:
12	-full background check by local police
13	-concealed weapons permit
14	 -firearm training in Kentucky (for more information go to www.kyfirearmstraining.com)
15	
16	Section 3: Any time the firearm is removed from the safe, the local police must be alerted and file a report on
17	the situation. If any person misuses the firearms allowed on school grounds, they will immediately be
18	arrested. The sentence will be determined by the local police based on the degree of misuse.
19	
20	Section 4: The money needed to provide schools with firearms and safes will come out of their yearly
21	allotted state funding.
22	

23 Section 5: This bill will go into effect January 1st the year after this bill has been passed.
