1 2	An act to require foreign language immersion in all public elementary schools.
3 4 5	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
5 6 7 8 9 10	Section I: This bill would require all public elementary schools in the Commonwealth of Kentucky to provide their students with foreign language instruction on the immersion level. The immersion level goes beyond the routine of listening, reading, speaking and writing the new language as it allows students the opportunity to attain high levels of proficiency.
11 12 13 14 15	Section II: In today's society, we need more bilingual speakers to stay competitive in the global economy. Educators say that the youngest brains have the greatest aptitude for absorbing language and it increases a student's level of language proficiency compared to waiting until middle or high school.
16 17 18 19	Section III: All elementary schools will be required to teach a minimum of 2 foreign languages during the two years and the addition of a third language will come during the third year of the program. Languages offered will primarily based on the regional needs of the schools.
20 21 22	Section IV: Funding for this bill will be provided by the Kentucky Department of Education and the allocations provided to them by the U.S. Department of Education.
23 24 25	Section V: The Kentucky Department of Education and local Board of Educations will be responsible for enforcing the new policies set forth with this bill.
26	Section VI: This bill will go into effect for the new school year.
