1 An act to provide after school transportation for students with extra-curricular activities.

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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

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5 Section 1: In order to enable more students stay after for extra-curricular activities, one bus will take  
6 students home one hour after school dismissal, another bus two hours after dismissal, and a third three  
7 hours after dismissal, based on need.

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9 Section 2: Transportation can vary depending on the amount of students who need transportation. Just like  
10 free and reduced lunch forms are handed out, forms for extra-curricular transportation will be handed out as  
11 well. The form will ask for information such as time the activity is over, how long the activity last over-all,  
12 emergency contact information, and the address of the student. If the parent or guardian doesn't wish to  
13 have their child be dropped off by the bus, they have to sign a paper stating that they will be responsible for  
14 their child's transportation.

16 Section 3: The routes will be designated by a committee that will be formed to fit each school's time of each  
17 activity. This committee and the school will determine the costs. Depending on the amount of students the  
18 means of transportation will vary. If there are fewer students a van could be used instead of a bus to save  
19 money.

21 Section 4: While the start up of this bill will cost money from the taxpayers, the hope is for this money to  
22 come right back to the school through student and community support and involvement. The hope is for this  
23 bill to, over time, pay for itself.

25 Section 5: This will be put into effect in the 2014-2015 school year.
