- 1                   An act to require all Kentucky public school teachers to be certified in First-Aid and CPR.

- 3                   **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
- 4
- 5   Section 1: Presently in the Commonwealth of Kentucky, only nurses and coaches in public schools are
- 6   required to be certified in CPR and First-Aid. This bill will require all Kentucky public school teachers to be
- 7   certified in First-Aid and CPR.
- 8
- 9   Section 2: First-Aid and CPR training will enable Kentucky public school teachers to learn basic medical skills
- 10   that may be used in various school settings.
- 11
- 12   Section 3: If you apply First-Aid to an injured person the chances of him/her surviving increase greatly. This
- 13   is especially true during the waiting period that you have to undergo while waiting for medical professionals
- 14   to arrive to help during the emergency.

- 16   Section 4: This bill will go into effect July 1, 2014
