1 2	An act to require all K-12 classroom teachers to obtain technology training.
3	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
4 5 7 8 9 10	Section 1: The amount of technology in KY schools is growing at a significant rate. Many schools have laptops, SmartBoards, personal reading devices, tablets, websites, apps, etc. However, what is not growing at a significant rate is teachers' ability to adequately teach using such devices. In many schools, the students know more about the technology than the teachers. Teacher training in the use of technology is a key factor to improving student performance and motivation.
11 12 13 14 15	Section 2: The purpose of this bill is to require all K–12 classroom teachers to obtain 10 hours of technology training (professional development) during the first five months of each school year. By enacting this bill as a state, we will increase teachers' knowledge of technology thereby having a positive impact on student learning.
16 17 18 19	Section 3: Teachers may obtain the technology training through school-based or district based professional development as well as through independent teacher training sources such as the International Society for Technology in Education (ISTER).
20 21 22 23	Section 4: This bill be funded by the Kentucky Lottery funds allocated towards education as well as the Teachers' professional growth fund –156.553b. Teachers, individual schools, and school districts may also pay for technology training through grants.
24 25 26	Section 5: This bill will be enforced by each school district across Kentucky and reported to the Kentucky Dept. of Education.
27 28 29 30 31	Section 6: Teachers who do not earn the required number of hours will be given a professional letter of reprimand and then given a set time to complete the required training. If the training is not completed during the established extension, it will result in their professional KY teaching license being revoked. A teacher's place of employment will be notified if a letter or reprimand is given and if a license is revoked.
32	Section 7: This bill will go into effect on August 1, 2014.
