- 1 An act to prohibit smoking while in a car with children under the age of sixteen and a half.

- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
- 4
- 5 Section 1: The purpose of this bill is to make sure children under the age of sixteen and a half are not
- 6 exposed to second hand smoke while riding in a car.
- 7
- 8 Section 2: This law has been passed in 7 states, including Arkansas and Illinois. Every 8 seconds someone
- 9 dies from cigarette smoke. 82% of adults support banning smoking while children are in the vehicle. Second
- 10 hand smoke can lead to heart disease, stroke and lung disease.
- 11
- 12 Section 3: The costs for this would be minimal as this would fall under the State Police Department and
- 13 treated as a moving violation.
- 14
- 15 Section 4: The penalty would be \$100 per offense.
- 16
- 17 Section 5: This law will go into effect one month after passage.
