1 An act to lower the sales tax on school supplies and electronics during the first week of August to help low
2 income families with children returning to school.
3

4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5
6 Section 1: The first weekend of August (Friday, Saturday, Sunday) sales tax on school supplies will be
7 reduced to 3%.

8
9 Section 2: School supplied include paper, notebooks, folders, binders, erasers, pencils, pens, highlighters,
10 colored pencils, crayons, markers, scissors, glue, rulers, backpacks, lunch boxes, and calculators.

12 Section 3: A store failure to follow the bill will result in
13 a. 1st offense-Fine of \$500
14 b. 2nd offense-Fine of \$1000
15 c. 3rd offense-Closing of the store until the previous fines are paid and the store agrees to comply
16 with the law.
17 d. Punishment for any offenses following the 3rd will repeat the consequences of offenses 1 to 3.

19 Section 4: The money from the fines will go the state general funds. This bill will be enforced by the
20 Kentucky Chamber of Commerce.This bill will go into effect the first weekend of August, 2014.
