| 5 6 7 | Section 1: The intention of this bill is to allow inmates with a life or death sentence to make the decision to have a physician assisted lethal injection. |
| 8 9 10 11 12 | Section 2: It is important to note that the death by lethal injection is completely the prisoners choice and in no way is the lethal injection mandatory. It is certainly possible that no inmates will choose this option but it allows inmates to make the choice of whether or not they desire to serve their sentence and live out their remaining years in prison. |
| 13 14 15 16 17 | Section 3: It is estimated that the price for a lethal injection is \$1,500 whereas the cost to house an inmate one year in prison is between \$25,000 and \$50,000. This bill will decrease prison costs and in return save tax payer money. Because Kentucky has previously used capital punishment, there will be little cost to implement this bill. |
| 18 19 20 | Section 4: Prisoners who choose this option will have an additional eight months before their execution occurs to contemplate their decision. |
