1 An act to require healthier school lunches by providing a salad bar in schools.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: This policy would be enforced for the 2014-2015 school year.

6
7 Section 2: The school can start a on small-scale with about 6 items, then your school is required to increase
8 the salad bar by one option per year for 5 years .

9
10 Section 3: Salad bars must be equally nutrient to be able to replace a school lunch and meet meal
11 requirements.

13 Section 4: The purchase of the produce gives the school an opportunity to support the local farmers and
14 thus improve the towns' economy.

16 Section 5: The school may apply for grants for funding of the salad bars.
