An act to require that all public high school students complete a certain number of community service hours.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: Presently in Kentucky, only private school students are required to complete a certain number of community service hours. This bill will require that students in all public high schools in the state of Kentucky complete community service hours.

Section 2: This act will not apply to students who are home schooled.

Section 3: Community service will be defined as any work done by a student within his or her community that is for the benefit others without receiving compensation.

Section 4: Each student at a public high school must complete a minimum of ten (10) community service hours in order to graduate. However, each public high school may require more hours of its students.

Section 5: Failure to reach the predetermining amount of service hours will result in the student attending a mandatory summer service project. This project is left up to the discretion of the public high schools. Each school must create its own mandatory summer service project that will ensure that the student who has not completed his or her hours will complete at least ten (10) hours.

Section 6: This bill will go into effect January 1st, the year after it has been passed.
