An act to require secondary teachers to obtain a bachelors degree in their field of study prior to teaching.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: All degree-seeking candidates, preparing for a teaching certificate in secondary education, must receive a bachelors degree in their area of concentration, in conjunction with their degree in secondary education.

Section 2: By altering the current requirements to obtain a teaching certificate in secondary education, it ensures that teachers have an in depth knowledge of their field of study, rather than being able to obtain a teaching certification with just a bachelors degree in teaching, and only an "area of concentration" received to teach a particular subject area.

Section 3: This bill will require candidates in secondary education to receive more rigorous coursework in the subject area that they plan to teach, by requiring enough credit hours in that particular subject to receive a bachelors degree.

Section 4: This bill will go into effect prior to the 2014 fall semester. Current enrolled candidates and previously certified teachers will not be affected by this change.
