1 2	An act to promote lawful residence and employment in Kentucky by requiring use of E-verify
3 4	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
5 6 7	Section 1: Currently to fight illegal immigration any employer that has a contract with the federal government has to use E-verify.
8 9 10 11	Section 2: E-verify is an internet-based, free program run by the United States government that cross references information from an employee's Employment Eligibility Verification Form I-9 to data from U.S government records.
12 13 14 15	Section 3: E-verify has a success rate of 98.65% with .26% being confirmed later and 1.09% never authorised to work, the people not authorized to work, either never contest the authorization or contest and are verified as illegal aliens.
16 17 18 19	Section 4: Currently hiring illegal aliens, or helping illegal aliens commit fraud or abuse on documents is already a federal civil violation, with penalties that ranges from 1,000 dollars to 23,000 dollars per worker. It is also a criminal violation to hire an illegal alien and incurs a penalty of 3,000 dollars to 6 months in jail.
20 21 22 23	Section 5: Currently hiring illegal aliens, or helping illegal aliens commit fraud or abuse on documents is already a federal civil violation, with penalties that ranges from 1,000 dollars to 23,000 dollars per worker. 24 25 26	Section 6: The penalty for not using e verify shall be 1,000 dollars per worker and on a second offense a 10- day removal of their business license.
27 28 29	Section 7: By requiring businesses to use E-verify, it will encourage businesses to be more lawful in hiring processes, and discourage illegal aliens from trying to acquire jobs because of the difficulty to commit their crime.
