1 An act to increase the age that persons can buy energy drinks to 18 years old.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: Energy drinks have been proven to cause the following symptoms in youth; depression, diabetes,
6 poor sleeping habits, premature aging, increased heart rate and increase blood pressure

8 Section 2: Businesses selling energy drinks will be required to ask for an id for all customers who look under
9 40 years of age. If businesses do not comply with the law penalties will incur.

10
11 1st offense - \$500
12 2nd offense - \$1000
13 3rd offense - \$2000 and businesses will loose their liquor and tobacco licenses for 30 days. The buisness
14 owner may be asked to attend an information class on the dangers of energy drink consumption by the
15 Alcohol Beverage Commission.

17 Section 3: The Alcohol Beverage Commission will be in charge of enforcing the law through three successful
18 programs; Cops in Shops, Operation Zero Tolerance, and Investigative Aide

19
20 Section 4: This bill will go into effect January 2014.
