1 An act to reserve tax revenue from tourist attractions in Powell County for education.
2

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section 1: Under this law any institution listed as a tourist attraction would be required to give their revenue
6 generated from taxes to the public school system.
7

8 Section 2: This has proven successful for other places such as Myrtle Beach, SC which requires the tax
9 revenue from all golf courses to be reserved for education.

11 Section 3: Powell County is a place with limited economic growth. Tourism, as limited as it may be, is still one
12 of our top sources of income in our county and the tax revenue from such businesses would significantly
13 improve the quality of our schools and resources.

15 Section 4: This law would provide more money for the schools from within the community and therefore
16 increase the stake holders in our schools. This would result in more community support as well as the
17 financial benefits of the law.
