- 1 An act to set a legal amount of foster homes required for the population of the regions of Kentucky
- 2
- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
- 4
- 5 Section 1: Currently in Kentucky more than 6,800 children are in the Cabinet for Health and Family Services
- 6 (CHFS) Foster Care. Many of these homes are over populated. This act will set a minimal number of foster
- 7 homes for a set population.
- 8
- 9 Section 2: Currently for every 149 children in Kentucky, 1 is in foster care. So for every 894 children under
- 10 the age of eighteen, there shall be 1 foster home operating (being that each foster home houses no more
- 11 than six children at one time).
- 12
- 13 Section 3: The foster homes created by this act shall be funded by the state of Kentucky.
- 14
- 15 Section 4: This bill will go into effect 1 year after the bill is passed.
