1 An act to require all counties in Kentucky to establish at least one homeless shelter.

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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

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5 Section 1: Kentucky has one of the largest populations of homeless people in the United States. We want all
6 counties in Kentucky to be required to have a homeless shelter.

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8 Section 2: Having a homeless shelter in every county will reduce the homeless population in Kentucky. In the
9 state of Kentucky there are nearly 7,500 homeless people and nearly 600 of them are military veterans.
10 1600 of the 7500 homeless people are children.

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12 Section 3: If counties do not establish a homeless shelter within their county line then they shall be fined the
13 appropriate amount according to their population of homeless people.

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15 • The starting amount for not having a homeless shelter- will be \$400.
16 • For every 50 homeless people the fine for a county will go up \$100.

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18 Section 4: The Kentucky Housing Corporation will manage all rules, regulations and fines in regards to
19 homeless shelters in Kentucky.

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21 Section 5: All counties in Kentucky will be eligible for an Emergency Solutions Grant to assist in
22 supplementing the cost. Additional needs of the shelters will primarily run from donations around the state.

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24 Section 6: This bill will go into effect January 1, 2015.
