1 An act to protect the privacy of Kentucky Lottery winners

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

4  
5 Section 1: In recent years, high jackpot lottery drawings seem to be more common. The benefits of winning  
6 such a lottery are obvious and well known. However, there are consequences of being a "lucky" winner-  
7 especially when identifying information about the winner is publicly disclosed. Lottery winners are besieged  
8 with requests. Sometimes the requests are just scams. Public disclosure of a lottery winner's identifying  
9 information makes the winner vulnerable to this sort of activity. This can include burglary, kidnapping,  
10 harassment, fraudulent lawsuits, etc.

11  
12 Section 2: With today's economy, winning the lottery has become the American dream for some people. For  
13 the people lucky enough to win the lottery, protection should be in place for them. This bill prohibits the  
14 Kentucky Lottery from releasing the names of lottery winners to the public or to the media. By addressing  
15 this issue, we can protect lottery winners from criminal activity.

16  
17 Section 3: Because it is a safety issue, this bill will be enforced by the Kentucky State Police.

18  
19 Section 4: There will be no need for additional funding for this bill because we are just reducing the amount  
20 of information let out to the public to ensure the safety of the winners.

21  
22 Section 5: There will be a three month suspension of the state's lottery privileges if information is released  
23 about the lottery winner.

24  
25 Section 6: All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this bill are hereby considered null and void.

26  
27 Section 7: This bill will go into effect January 1, 2014.
