This holds true for all locations in Kentucky. 14 15 Section 2: The purpose of this bill serves to protect fellow citizens from the dangers and risks of secondhand 16 smoke. 17 18 Section 3: The following bill will be supported by Smoke Free Kentucky and the Tobacco Prevention and 19 Cessation Program. They will support it by funding any unplanned expenses (this does not include fines). 20 21 Section 4: The effect of this bill will serve is to ban smoking from public places (listed above) by May 2014. 22 23 Section 5: For individual smoking (not in a restaurant): 24 25 First offense: \$150 26 Second offense: \$350 27 Third offense: \$700 28 After third offense, \$850 for each following offense. 29 30 For institutions allowing smoking (restaurants, fairs, parks, other): 31 32 First offense: \$250 33 Second offense: \$600 34 Third offense: The business faces losing its permit.

NOTE: If an individual is smoking in an institution or at an event where the organization does not allow

smoking, than the individual will face the fine.
