An act to enforce citizens over fifty-five to retake their drivers test every four years.

Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: This bill will require every driving Kentucky senior fifty-five years of age or older to retake their driver's test every four years. This bill will also require every driving citizen over the age of seventy to retake their driver's test and permit test.

Section 2: We are proposing this bill because senior driver's crash rates are increasing. According to the Wall Street Journal there are 90,000 fatal crashes caused by seniors every year. If broken down by state that would mean that Kentucky has 1,800 fatal crashes caused by seniors every year.

Section 3: In previous years, more than 5,500 older adults were killed in car crashes in the United States and more than 183,000 were injured. This amounts to about 300 injured elderly Kentucky citizens a month. These statistics also prove that about another possible 300 middle aged or teenage drivers were injured due to seniors possibly causing these crashes.

Section 4: This bill will go into effect between the dates of June 30, 2014 and January 1, 2015.

Section 5: This bill will also require consequences if a citizen does not comply with the rules stated:

First Offense: \$25 dollar fine Second Offense: \$75 dollar fine Third Offense: \$125 dollar fine

Fourth Offense: \$200 dollar fine and the citizen's license will be suspended until the fine has been paid, the

citizen goes to traffic school and they pass their drivers test again.

Section 6: This bill will cost the citizen \$20 if they are between the ages of fifty-five and sixty-nine years old. It costs \$20 to get a new license and the driver's test is free. If the citizen is over the age of seventy it will cost \$32. As always the driver's test is free, the license itself is \$20 and the permit test is \$12. The government will have to pay for more DMV workers to administer the tests and work with the increase of visitors, but if 275,000 Kentucky seniors out of the 325,000 seniors in Kentucky drive, they would pay for two new DMV workers per county.
