An act to require all school athletes to be randomly drug tested twice a year.

## Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: This bill will enact that athletes in sixth through twelfth grade will be randomly drug tested, so student athletes won't do drugs and stay healthier.

Section 2: Student athletes will be randomly drug tested at least two time a year. Most schools have drug testing, but it's not mandatory and if drug testing does occur it does not guarantee that every athlete will be tested.

Section 3: This bill will potentially reduce the number of athletes doing drugs in the schools in Kentucky. It will also help stop drug abuse among Kentucky Middle and High School students.

Section 4: If this law is broken:

1st year not implemented: \$1000 fine 2nd year not implemented: \$3000 fine 3rd year not implemented: \$5000 fine

4th year not implemented: The school district athletic teams may not compete with their respective associations (i.e. Kentucky High School Basketball team could not compete in the KHSAA).

Section 5: This bill will be funded by the Division of Surplus Properties which is located in Kentucky's Finance and Administration cabinet, as well as, the Kentucky Department of Health and the individual school districts. The drug test are approximately \$12 per student, which include the urinalysis test and the lab work.

Section 6: This bill will be enforced by the Kentucky Health Department and the individual school districts.

Section 7: All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this bill are here by repealed.

Section 8: This law will go into effect starting on August 1, 2014.
