- 1 An act to require that all staff members in public schools in the commonwealth of Kentucky to be trained in
- 2 first aid and emergency procedures.

- 4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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- 6 Section 1: By having all staff members in public schools trained in first aid and emergency procedures, which
- 7 would provide more immediate care in life or death situations, instead of risking a life when an ambulance
- 8 isn't able to respond quickly enough.
- 9
- 10 Section 2: The cost to implement this bill would be a one time fee of \$200.00-300.00 for training of district
- 11 nurses. Additional fees would be incurred for CPR training for district personnel. Funding would be through
- 12 district resources and additional funding could be obtained from grants and/or partnerships with local
- 13 hospitals.

- 15 Section 3: To implement all public school staff members to be trained in first aid and emergency procedures,
- 16 the district nurse(s) would be responsible for training.

- 18 Section 4: This bill will go into effect for the 2014-2015 school year.
