1 An act to enforce a state wide website that includes a simple process to report any harsh form of cyber
2 bullying
3

4 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
5

6 Section 1: The state of Kentucky will have a simple, easy access, statewide website to use to report any
7 form of harsh cyber-bullying that occurs concerning people of residence in the state of KY.

9 Section 2: The information box will provide quick processing of the incident(s). Example...
10 _ Copy and paste URL of website of incident
11 _ Insert of picture/scan of document of incident
12 _ Name of the person/people being bullied
13 _ Username or screen name of the person/people being cyber-bullied
14 _ If the child(ren) being bullied is under the age of 18, list the contact information of the
15 parent(s)/guardian(s).
16 _ Username or screen name of person/people committing the ACT of cyber-bullying
17 _ If the person committing the act of cyber-bullying is under the age of 18, list the
18 contact information of the parent(s)/guardian(s).

19 Section 3: This bill will become a law six months after passing so as to allow time to complete the website.
20

21 Section 4: The Cyber Cop Committee, aka CCC, will receive any reports of cyber-bullying reported about
22 residents of the state of Kentucky. CCC will be in charge of managing and designing the
23 website, researching said website to confirm the cyber-bullying incidences, and issuing the
24 forms of punishment designated in Section 5.

26 Section 5: First Offense: Warning
27 - contacted by phone or email along with the parent/guardian of someone under 18
28 Second Offense: Fine
29 - a fine ranging from \$500 - \$1,000 depending on the severity (decided by judge), not
30 including the court cost
31 Third Offense: Extreme fine/ Serving time
32 - an extreme fine ranging from \$5,000 - \$10,000
33 - severity will be determined by the judge and will include either jail time or community service
34 - age of bullied child(dren) may affect the punishment
35 - If the bully(ies) is/are 12 and under = maximum fine
36 - If the bully(ies) is/are 13-17 = community service hours
37 - If the bully(ies) is/are 18 or above = serve up to 1 year in jail
38

39 Section 6: Funding for this bill will come from the KY State Lottery revenue and from moneys collected
40 from fines of 2nd and 3rd offenses. It will be used to pay officers and enhance the CCC
41 program (i.e. - upgrades of technical equipment, advertising, hiring more officers, etc.)
