1 An act to require schools in Kentucky to provide nutritional information on all lunch menus.
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3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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5 Section 1: The bill requires all lunch menus in the schools of Kentucky to have ingredients and nutritional
6 information on them.
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8 Section 2: School board members and all elementary, middle and high school cafeterias in Kentucky must
9 abide by this law.
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11 Section 3: Certain nutrition facts and ingredients must be displayed on lunch menus.
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13 Section 4: The nutrition information to be displayed are the calories, carbohydrates, fats, proteins, sodium
14 and vitamins.
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16 Section 5: This bill will be enforced by the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE).
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18 Section 6: It has no extreme cost, but it may cost money to pay for ink and paper which will be absorbed
19 by the school district.
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21 Section 7: Failure to abide by this law will result in the following penalties:
22 1st offense: The KDE will give the school a warning.
23 2nd offense: The KDE will fine the school \$500.
24 3rd offense: The KDE will fine the school \$1,000.
25 4th offense: The KDE will fine the school \$1,000 and take over the school district in compliance
26 with the law.
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28 Section 8: All laws or parts in conflict with this bill are hereby repealed.
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30 Section 9: This bill will go into effect on July 1st, 2015, after passage and the signature of the Governor.
