1           An act to require security systems (including cameras) in all public schools in the state of KY.  
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3                           **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**  
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5 Section 1: Gun violence in schools has become a great concern in Kentucky and the rest of the United States.  
6 When parents drop their kids off at school in the mornings, they should feel that they are safe. Students  
7 should feel safe while in school and not be distracted by the thought of potential violence in their classes.  
8 Teachers should feel safe as they prepare and deliver lessons to their students. This feeling of safety can be  
9 provided by ensuring that every school has a security camera system that monitors who gets in or out of the  
10 building.

12 Section 2: We need to protect the schools in Kentucky from invasions. This bill will make schools more secure  
13 and might prevent the next school tragedy. We are talking about the lives of our fellow classmates,  
14 teachers, and ourselves. This could prevent dangerous people from entering our schools. The cost is nothing  
15 compared to someone's life.

17 Section 3: The funding for this bill would come from the Kentucky Department of Education and would go  
18 into effect 90 days following the passed date.  
19  
20 Section 4: The law would be enforced by the local board of education and police. The first violation would be  
21 a warning. The second violation would be a fine of \$500. A third violation could result in school closure.
