- 1 An act to require that Kentucky pharmacists receive a prescription to dispense Sudafed products.

- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
4
- 5 Section 1: This bill will require that all Kentucky residents will need a prescription to purchase any drug
6 products containing Sudafed.

- 8 Section 2: Pharmacists who provide patients with Sudafed based products without a prescription will face
9 the following penalties:

- 11 1st Offense - \$3,000.00 fine
12 2nd Offense - Suspension of license to practice pharmacy for 1 year
13 3rd Offense - Permanent loss of license to practice pharmacy

- 15 Section 3: Funding for this bill will be provided by the cabinet for Health and Family Services. Money received
16 from fines will also fund this program.

- 18 Section 4: Upon passage, this will become law on July 1st, 2014.
