1 An act to require Kentucky establishments serving alcohol to administer breathalysers by a trained valet.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

5 Section I: This bill will require for there to be at least one valet at every bar in the Commonwealth of
6 Kentucky. This will make an impact on adults 21 and over or any person entering the bar as well as innocent
7 drivers.

9 Section II: Every establishment serving alcohol will be instructed to hire or delegate at least one valet, who
10 will ask for the keys of the driver's vehicle prior to the person entering the bar. Then before the driver is
11 allowed to retrieve the keys, he/she is required to take a breathalyzer test given by the valet. If the driver
12 exceeds the allowable alcohol content (0.08%), then he/she is prohibited from having his/her car/keys until
13 the alcohol level is within legal limits or other transportation is arranged.

15 Section III: This bill would prevent DUI's, fines, jail expenses, car accidents, medical fees, and -- most
16 importantly -- death in some cases.

18 Section IV: The cost of this bill would be \$2,000 from the state, mainly for the cost of notifying and
19 publicizing -- mostly through mailings. The cost for the valet, breathalyzer, and training would be paid by the
20 establishments serving alcohol because they are responsible for the proper use of alcohol that people
21 consume at their place of business.

23 Section V: This bill would take FULL effect in July of 2014.
