- 1                   An act to enforce all schools buses to have a camera and be reviewed daily.
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- 3                   **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
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- 5 Section 1: According to statistics, 30% of students are bullied at school, with at least 10% happening on the
- 6 school bus. Also, 24% of drug offences occur on school bus as well. In Kentucky all school buses are
- 7 required to have cameras. This bill would require all cameras to be reviewed daily by each bus driver or by
- 8 the school's director of transportation.
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- 10 Section 2: The Director of transportation is the supervisor of all bus drivers. All school buses have camera in
- 11 Kentucky. Some even have more than one but these camera are not reviewed daily. They are only reviewed if
- 12 a problem is reported.

- 14 Section 3: If schools do not follow this bill the first offence will be a warning and a written reprimand. The
- 15 second offence will be a fine of \$100
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- 17 Section 4: The Kentucky department of education is in charge of enforcing this law.
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- 19 Section 5: It would cost an extra hour of pay for each bus driver.
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- 21 Section 6: It would take effect six months after the bill was passed.
