1 2	An act to require a warrant for search and/or seizure of an individual's smartphone.
3 4	Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky
5 6 7	Section I: Currently, police have the unrestricted ability to obtain access to personal information on smartphone devices including financial data, health care information, social details, protected passwords, email records, and photographic images.
8 9 10 11 12	Section II: This bill will protect individuals' Fourth Amendment rights guaranteed by the U.S. Constitution and reiterated in the Kentucky Constitution, Section 10, pertaining to the clause that condemns the unreasonable seizure of personal property, specifically relating in this bill to smartphone devices.
13 14 15 16	Section III: Law enforcement officers violating this law will go through intra-organizational investigations, and also will be barred from testifying in the court of law with any findings pertaining to cases where the violation occurred.
17 18 19	Section IV: Any evidence that is obtained in a situation that violates this law shall be disregarded in any court of law or criminal proceedings.
20 21	Section V: The bill has no direct costs associated with its passage.
22	Section VI: This bill will be enacted following the passage and signature of the governor on January 1, 2014.
