- 1 An act to reward KEES money bonuses to ALL students who score between 3-5 on AP and IB exams.

- 3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**
4
- 5 Section 1: Presently, students who qualify for free and reduced lunch also qualify for extra KEES money
6 bonuses for scoring between a 3 and 5 on their AP and IB exams.
7
- 8 Section 2: This bill if passed, will allow ALL Kentucky students to be awarded KEES money bonuses; whereas,
9 the current program allows bonuses to be awarded only to students eligible for Free or Reduced Lunch.

- 11 Section 3: This bill pertains to all Kentucky high Schools students who take AP or IB exams.

- 13 Section 4: This bill is expected to increase approximately \$2.2 million to the current budget of \$64 million
14 currently used toward KEES awards.

- 16 Section 5: The funding for this bill will continue to come from the Kentucky Lottery.

- 18 Section 6: This bill will go into effect the upcoming school year after passage.
