An act to mandate second-hand metal shops to use the program LeadsOnline.

## Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

Section 1: LeadsOnline is a technology service that automatically reports transactions to law enforcement for use in criminal investigations. This service can be used in many ways including finding stolen goods, solving homicides, and even securing meth lab locations. This bill seeks to require all businesses involved in the buying and selling of gold and other precious metals (including secondhand dealers, pawnshops and gold-buyers) to report all transactions involving payment to law enforcement officers via LeadsOnline.

Section 2: LeadsOnline accelerates investigation processes for law enforcement while also making it more efficient. This program comes at no cost to businesses, as it is a free program that is available to the public.

Section 3:The information received from businesses is stored in a remote and very secure server at the LeadsOnline headquarters. The information is sorted by date, item, and location of sale, law enforcement agents are able to search through LeadsOnline and search for items based on these criteria.

Section 4:This bill will go into effect immediately after passage.
