1 An act to A proposal to supply education for human rights issues at schools in Argentina.

3 **Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations**

5 Justification Clause: Argentina is a country renowned for heroic efforts against impunity, economic
6 disenfranchisement, and social exclusion. In 2013, President Christina Fernandez de Kirchner secured
7 passage of legislation that persecuted anyone who is in violation of these laws. However, the public is
8 uneducated on what these violations are. These ongoing human rights concerns include police abuse, poor
9 prison conditions, torture, and failure to protect indigenous rights. Argentina continues to make significant
10 progress on prosecuting officials for abuses committed during the country's "Dirty War" from (1976-1983)
11 but trials have been subject to delays. This proposal will help individuals to be better educated on the matter
12 of human rights violations which will, in turn, better the next generation of the Argentine community.

14 Section I: This bill will only cost the United Nations \$42,000/year (€326,235). Any regular Social Studies or
15 religion teacher is qualified to teach this, therefore, an additional teacher does not need to be hired.

17 Section II: This proposal will provide workshops that educate those in public schools in Argentina on the
18 history of human rights and current events.

19
20 Section III: To participate in this workshop, each participant must complete at least 10 service hours prior to
21 taking the course.

23 Section IV: This workshop requires every participant to sign a behavior contract.

25 Section IV: This proposal will be active by the beginning of the 2014-2015 school year.
