1 An act to help fix the current financial crisis in Belize by utilizing existing natural resources

3 **Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations**

5 Justification Clause: Belize is currently \$1.0156 billion (1,015,600,000 in US dollars) in debt, which
6 continues to rise. Our proposal aims to help lower this debt while also fixing Belize's poverty and
7 unemployment problem, since Belize's unemployment rate is currently 11.3%, which is very high. Also,
8 Belize's current population below poverty line is 41.3% (as of 2013). By creating jobs, we can help fix Belize's
9 unemployment problem and help lower Belize out of debt and poverty.

11 Section 1: We propose to utilize the geographical location of Belize to create jobs. We can create many jobs
12 for harvesting limestone, clay, and marble for the construction industry. These natural minerals are found
13 abundant in Belize.

15 Section 2: Creating jobs will help lift Belize out of debt and poverty by allowing unemployed people to have
16 these new jobs and support their families, while contributing a mandatory 25% salary tax from their income
17 to help Belize's debt. Having Belize out of debt would increase the quality of the country and attract more
18 tourism.

20 Section 3: Not only is Belize in major debt, but other South American countries such as Mexico, Brazil, and
21 Argentina. Belize will be the major starting step to bringing South American countries back on track, and if it
22 is successful, can be a model of how to get out debt as well as increase the quality of their country.

24 Section 4: Section 4: The costs to this proposal shall be provided by the United Nations in order to avoid
25 complicating Belize's debt. The costs of this proposal comprises the costs of harvesting natural resources
26 such as the equipment and facilities, building costs, and employee wages. This proposal will provide 10,000
27 jobs to those unemployed. It would cost \$50 million, which is extremely small compared to Belize's debt. The
28 costs of this proposal will pay for itself overtime and help repair South America.

30 Section 5: The money donated by the UN will be controlled by the Belize government and will be used as
31 needed for payments and salaries of the workers of the new jobs.

33 Section 6: By voting for this proposal, you are helping to improve the quality and development of South
34 American countries, which will help stabilize the world economy and diversify natural resources of every
35 country.

37 Section 7: This proposal will go into effect January 1, 2015.
