An act to create tranquility along the Colombian/Venezuelan border

Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations

Justification Clause: Since 2010, rebel forces have made camps along the Colombia and Venezuelan border. The Venezuelan government has responded by placing military vehicles and personnel on there side of the border. The Venezuelans have become increasingly aggressive as they search out rebels. An invasion of Colombia could cause many countries who have allied themselves with either country to become involved in a military conflict. This proposal is designed to prevent armed conflict along this border.

Section 1: A Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) shall be formed on the Venezuelan/Colombian border. It shall extend 20 miles on both sides of the border. Neither country will be permitted to place active duty military personnel or military vehicles in the zone without explicit approval from both thee United Nations Security Council and the other country.

Section 2: The DMZ will be enforced by UN Peacekeeping forces stationed at intervals along the border. If a country is found to have troops in the DMZ, the Peacekeeping forces will have the right to apprehend the troops and report them to the United Nations. If either country is reported as having troops in the DMZ, UN investigators will immediately investigate the offense. If the investigation reveals that a country has placed troops in the DMZ, the offending country will be cut off from UN aid, or the support of other UN members in military combat as punishment.

Section 3: All citizens of either Colombia or Venezuela who have property inside the DMZ will remain the owners of their land and they can use it for any purpose as long as it corresponds with the laws of the countries in which the property is located. The DMZ will last for 5 years, but can be reinstated through the popular vote of the UN General Assembly. This proposal will become enacted two weeks after its passage. These two weeks will be used to transport UN Peacekeeping troops to the region, and for both countries to remove any forces that are stationed in the DMZ.
