1 2	An act to initiate a Zero Tolerance Policy for possession of Lethal Chemical Weapons among nations
- 3 4	Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations
5	Justification Clause: Under the Chemical Weapons Convention (1993), there is a legally-binding, world-wide
6	ban on the production, stockpiling, and use of chemical weapons and their precursors. Despite the efforts of
7	the CWC, several countries (including Russia, Syria, and The United States) continue to stockpile lethal
8	chemical weapons. The use of chemical weapons is controversial and a moral issue for military and political
9	leaders. Military leaders have publically stated that chemical weapons pose one of the greatest threats to
10	soldiers in modern combat. Many chemical weapons can remain in ground water and soil long after they are
11	dispersed, making them a threat to innocent civilian populations.
12	
12 13	Section I: Any country found in possession of lethal chemical weapons shall be allotted 30 days to properly
14 15	dispose of said stockpile.
15	
16	Section II: If any nation is found in violation of this proposal has not eradicated their stockpile after the
17	allotted 30 days for proper removal, they will be charged with a fine of \$2,000,000 for every 30 days they
17 18 19	continue to be uncooperative.
19	
20 21 22	Section III: Nations found in violation of this proposal will be financially responsible for proper removal.
21	
22	Section IV: The UN will take further action if said country does not properly dispose of chemical weapons
23	after 365 of continuing to possess their stockpile. Further actions include (but are not limited to) higher
24 25	fines, and/or temporary termination of trade with aforementioned nation. The precise course of further
20	action will be voted upon by the UN if and when this scenario arises.
