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An act to improve education in third world countries.

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Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations

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Justification Clause: Inadequate education resources in developing countries inhibit growth and the ability to create a strong, sustainable economy. Improved education would allow equal and fair growth among all third world countries.

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Section I: This bill creates a program through the Department of Economic and Social Affairs that allows graduate education students in first world countries to gain experience by teaching students in third world countries for four months

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Section II: There would be two sessions for teaching. These would be from September 1st to December 31st, and from January 1st to April 31st. Schools may request graduate student teachers or the United Nations may assign teachers to a school.

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Section III: Each first world graduate school may enter up to five graduate students into the program. Graduate students will enter the program by application, through recommendation from teachers and community leaders, a validation of linguistic proficiency, and a GPA requirement.

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Section IV: Funding for the students' housing, food, and travel will be split evenly between the university, the student, and the United Nations. Funding from the United Nations will come out of the Department of Economic and Social Affairs budget. Scholarship will be available through schools if applicable.

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Section V: This bill will go into effect January 1st 2015.
