1 An act to create mandatory inspections of medicine factories in India.

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3 **Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations**

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5 Justification Clause: India, the third-largest exporter of over-the-counter and prescription drugs to the
6 world, is coming under increased scrutiny by the World Health Organization (WHO) for safety lapses and
7 falsified drug test results and selling inconsistently made medicines. India exports \$15 billion dollars of its
8 product annually. The World Health Organization estimated that one in five drugs created in India are fake.
9 Currently no inspections are being made on the factories that produce medicine in India..

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11 Section One: The World Health Organization estimates that one in five drugs created in India are incorrectly
12 dosed. This proposal will require that medicine production plants will be investigated twice a year by WHO
13 officers, to ensure that all citizens of the world have access to safe and regulated medicine.

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15 Section Two: This bill will be enforced by WHO officers, and the inspections will be biannual. Any medical
16 production plant that has an inconsistency rate of 20% must, after the first two inspections, drop to 10% at
17 minimum. If not, a fine will be assessed by the World Health Organization.

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19 Section Three: The inspections will occur mainly in the factories around New Delhi, but are not exclusive.

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21 Section Four: This bill will take effect at the start of 2015.
