An act to disband the United Nations

## Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations

Section I: The United Nations has failed not because of corrupt goals, rather because of far too outlandish goals and a governing body that is in itself corrupt and unconcerned with its own alleged goals.

 Section II: A prime example of the hypocrisy of the UBN is dealings with terrorist organizations, or rather lack thereof. The United Nations does not have a clear definition of terrorism nor do they intend to pursue one.
