An act to offer the opportunity for outsourcing jobs to Mexico

Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations

Justification Clause: When a country is over populated this leads to many citizens impoverished. These men and women struggle to find jobs that don't exist.

Section I: Countries such as China and India are considered 3rd World Countries and both battle the efforts to overcome over population. As a result, the percentage of the population below the poverty line is relatively high. A fairly recent survey taken in 2011 shows that in China, 13.4% of the population are below the poverty line. As of a survey conveyed in 2010, 29.8% of India's population is below the poverty line.

Section II: Mexico can use these men and women seeking for jobs, by outsourcing them to Mexico. This will be accomplished by offering a grant for companies that would like to accommodate in this mass outsourcing. Qualifications will be needed for being outsourced. These being the standard qualifications for the applied job and that you make below the average salary of the country.

Section III: This will be heavily informed to all lower class citizens in China and India that qualify.

Certain companies that will be targeted are such that will help stimulate the economy. Companies that drill oil, create textiles and manufactured goods will be the main corporations targeted. Another main occupation targeted will be soldiers in the war against cartels. Overpowering the drug cartels of Mexico will help build up the economy.

Outsourcing workers to Mexico will be done with grants given to said companies by the United Nations. For individual companies that will include oil, textile, and other corporations alike, the UN will cover 20% of the costs needed to transport and house the workers. The Mexican government will cover the full costs of transporting and housing soldiers.

Section IV: This bill will immediately go into effect upon passage.
