1 An act to increase tourism in Nepal

2
3 **Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations**

5 Justification Clause: Tourism plays a large part in Nepal's economy. It accounts for almost 5% of GDP and
6 over 1.2 million jobs out of the total population of 27 million citizens. This proposal would capitalize on
7 current growing tourism trends in Nepal by further increasing the vital infrastructure needed to promote
8 tourism. The aid money will help build roads, expand the electrical grid and strengthen border crossings
9 checkpoints that regularly close due to monsoon rains. New infrastructure will help Nepal accelerate its
10 growth and increase regional trade.

12 Section 1: Nepal will be granted a \$50 million (all figures in U.S. dollars) aid package from the United Nations
13 to update and improve infrastructure in Nepal. The money would go towards building roads, improving the
14 power grid, water supply, sewers and telecommunications, as well as funding for maintenance of new and
15 existing infrastructure.

17 Section 2: Part of the aid package will be spent on United Nations inspectors who will come to Nepal and
18 verify the aid is spent properly. These inspections will occur for ten years after this proposal is passed under
19 the following schedule:

21 • Years 1-3: biannual inspections
22 • Years 4-10: annual inspection

24 All investigation findings will be published annually.

26 Section 3: Any project requiring more than \$5 million from the aid package will be subject to increased
27 inspections by the United Nations.

29 Section 4: Based on inspection reports at the end of the ten year period, the U.N. can authorize an additional
30 aid package of up to \$100 million to further support Nepal's infrastructure. Further U.N. inspection
31 schedules will be determined at this time.

33 Section 5: This proposal will go into effect one year after passage.
