1 2	An act to cease production and to forbid the usage of nuclear weapons by all capable nations.
3 4	Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the United Nations
4 5 6 7	Justification Clause: The Nuclear Abolition Forum regarding international humanitarian law and nuclear weapons (2011) has set forth a generalized goal towards global nuclear disarmament and has stated explicitly: "It is clear that the United Nations has served as an indispensable arena for the world community
8 9 10	to advance its common goal in disarmament, which in recent years have included the advancement of humanitarian norms against the use and possession of nuclear weapons."
11 12 13 14	Section I: Currently, there are estimated to be between 17,300 and 20,000 warheads across the globe, many being held by member nations of the United Nations Assembly. Approximately 25% of these are considered operational and viably dangerous to the welfare of all nations.
15 16 17	Section II: Producing countries include and/or are presumed to be—Russia, United States, China, North Korea, United Kingdom, Syria, France, India, Israel, and Pakistan.
18 19 20 21	Section III: This proposal does not aim to cease production of nuclear energy nor does it seek to stop the positive effects of many nuclear facilities across the globe. The primary goal of this proposal is to ensure the vitality of the globe and its peoples by outlawing the use and production of nuclear warheads.
22 23 24	Section IV: If a country does not comply, they will be stripped of their United Nations privileges as a seated member nation and will be castigated through revocation of their voting seat in the General Assembly.
25 26 27	Section V: This proposal will become effective immediately following passage. All unmentioned or unforeseen logistics regarding this proposal will be decided by a majority vote in the General Assembly of the United Nations prior to/upon passage.
